

We serve as the "watchdog" for legislation affecting all Interior Designers, Architects and other design professionals. GAIDP was formed in response to a need to bring all practicing Interior Designers together to secure the right to practice Interior Design.




### How does it work?

We hire a professional lobbyist, the Hudson Group, to keep an eye on legislation and initiative happening at the State Capitol, good or bad, staying alert and advising the Alliance of anything that might adversely impact the industry. ### **SINCE 1989**, GAIDP HAS BEEN FIGHTING FOR INTERIOR DESIGNERS IN GEORGIA

GAIDP was founded, and Mary Duke, ASID, was the first. The new law went into effect July 1, 1992. The Board of The General Contractor Registration law passed. president accompanied by Margo Jones, FIBD, one of the first organizers. The fight for Interior Designer registration allowing independent practice and ability to obtain building permits.

An effort to change the existing law fell short. The presidents of AIA, ASID, IBD and ISID signed a national agreement stating that organizations would agree to a Title Act but no Practice Act. AIA apposed recognition for Interior Designers and lobbied the Georgia legislature heavily, gaining the support of the then Secretary of State.

support. Several hundred designers and hundreds of interior design students worked to educate the legislators.

The substitute to Senate Bill 168 passed into law, with the support for the accord on Title Acts signed by ASID, IBD, ISID, guidance of Bob Short. For the first time, Georgia law recognized the professional practice of Interior Design as a profession with a body of knowledge based on education and experience. Interior Designers still could not have a seal, but For the first time, Registered Interior Designers could submit

Architects developed rules to govern registration of Interior Designers. GAIDP and registered Interior Designers held seminars John Guest served on a committee tasked with drafting across the state on how to become registered. As of July 1994, 131 applications for registration had been received by the Board.

GAIDP tried for the first time to get equal coverage for Interior. Designers under the Lien Law. Representative Michelle Henson petitioned the State Attorney General Mike Bowers for a clarification ruling as to whether or not interior designers are covered by the present lien statute. He ruled they are not.

GAIDP led by President Janice Harding, ASID, and our lobbyist, Brian Hudson, passed a major revision to the Registered Interior Designer law, in collaboration with the AIA. For the first time, Registered Interior Designers in Georgia could seal and submit sealed drawings for permit for non-loadbearing construction.


The Senate Bill HB 480 aimed at amending the laws governing enacted. The Lien Law allows contractors, tradesman, suppliers, bankers, attorneys, architects, engineers, landscape architects, foresters and now registered interior designers, to establish a lien; a claim of the title of land or a structure, for value of their services; labor or product provided that increases the value of the real estate.

GAIDP still has work to do. More awareness must be brought to local jurisdictions regarding the qualifications Interior Designers have for projects considered "high hazard," clarifying the interpretation of O.C.G.A 25-5-14, and passing state legislation clearly mandating local jurisdictions cannot restrict Interior Designer's rights to practice provided under state law.





As a professional Interior Designer, I rely on GAIDP to keep me informed about any legislation that will affect my right to practice interior design in the State of Georgia. Their advocacy for legislation is imperative to our practice now and in the future.






